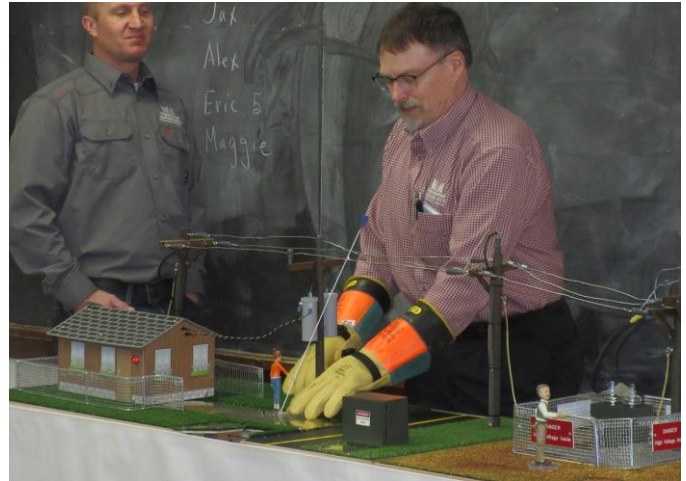
Sunday, March 15: Open gym from 1-3PM
